3. Purposes for which the personal data is processed and the lawfulness of processing

When using and operating the machinery, machine-generated data can include a personal reference to the employee operating the machinery. The operating/control data we provide via the IoT platform can be processed by us to visualise/produce statistical analyses (including preventative maintenance) and to improve our services and products.

The legal basis for processing this operating/control data is a legitimate interest in carrying out a system visualization/producing statistical analyses (including predictive maintenance) and to consistently improve our services and our products, also with regard to product safety in particular.

4. Storage period/erasure period

We only store personal data until it is not longer necessary in relation to the purposes for which it was collected or processed.

5. Transfer of data

We only transfer personal data to the following recipients or categories of recipients:

All members of the SSC and of the GSS Group.

6. Data security

We take technical and organisational security measures to protect the personal data stored from accidental or intentional tampering, loss or destruction and from access by unauthorised persons. Our security measures are consistently improved in line with the state of the art.

7. Legal remedies

Data subjects have the right to be informed, the right to rectification, the right to erasure, the right to restrict processing, the right to data portability and the right to object. You are entitled to exercise these rights vis à vis us. In particular, data subjects have the right at any time, for reasons relating to their own personal circumstances, to object to the processing of their personal data required due to our legitimate interests or those of a third party at any time. Such data will then no longer be processed unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for such processing which override the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subjects, or the processing serves the purpose of asserting, exercising or defending legal claims.

Should data subjects believe that processing of their data breaches data protection law or that their data protection rights have otherwise been violated in some way, they can also complain to the supervisory authority. The data protection authority [*Datenschutzbehörde*] is the body responsible in Austria.
